### A CRIMINAL PROCEEDING.

From the day of its inception to the present time great incapacity and needless waste of the public finances have characterized the waterworks committee, and the council which backs it up. Errors of judgment have been made from time to time, and additional costs have been incurred in almost every branch of the work. The upshot will be that before the system is completed the amount voted by the people for the scheme originally proposed will not only have been frittered away, but a supplementary vote of many thousands of dollars will have to be obtained. Time and again has the absurd action of the council been shown up in the columns of THE SIGNAL, but the victimized public have been lulled to rest by the specious explanations of the individuals who have been at fault, and the council has continued, through the waterworks committee, to make ducks and drakes of the public funds, by incurring expenditures which would not have been necessary had a proper course been adopted at the beginning. The work was commenced without any well-defined scheme, and as is invariably the case under such conditions, blunder has followed blunder, and needless expense has been entailed.

We have no desire at present to go into details of the items by which the public treasury has been depleted, and to many of our readers, who have kept track of the progress of the work, a detailed statement would not be necessary. On another occasion we may feel impelled to deal with this phase of the question more fully. Our desire is to let the people of Goderich know that the council has now sanctioned a scheme in connection with the waterworks supply which, if persisted in, will add to its already incompetent action the element of criminality.

As is already known, an effort is being made to obtain water by means of a series of artesian wells at the harbor, but even the members of the council and the engineer are now convinced that the supply will be insufficient to meet the demands for fire and domestic purposes. They claim that a sufficient quantity for domestic use can be obtained from the wells now bored, and to ensure a supply for fire purposes they have hit upon the plan of running a pipe into the harbor, and thus placing themselves in connection with the inexhaustible resources of Lake Huron.

Now, it is a well-known fact that the harbor is the receptacle of filth from a thousand different sources, and an analysis made of a sample obtained at the head of the pier—where it would of necessity be purer than inside the harbor—showed that it was of the foulest nature and utterly unfit for domestic use. Every boat that lies at our docks adds to the foulness of the water, and those of our readers who have been at the harbor when the Betty boats have been here, and who have noticed the continuous corrupt discharges into the harbor will be at once convinced that even indirect contact with the harbor water means contamination. But our local wisecracks pool-ohh objections on this line. Why, say they, don't you know that we only intend to use harbor water for fire purposes, and that when the necessity for using it is past, we in-

tend to "flush" the pipes and clean out the bad water, so that good water for domestic purposes can be obtained from the artesian wells?

Gentlemen of the council, that kind of talk won't do. After the pipes have been once defiled all the water in Lake Huron "flushed" through them would not make them clean. The piping is not cast so perfectly that resting-places for microbes and other diseased particles cannot be found, and filth cannot be thoroughly cleansed by a mere discharge of pure water. What one amongst you would take a culinary utensil for chamber use, and then, be the cleansing never so great, would care to use it for its original purpose? Some of the council members may think this analogy strong, but the best medical authority in town—nay, in the Province—will not fail to endorse our placing of it in the present case.

The contract for the work in connection with the taking of water from the harbor has been let at a cost of about \$550, but it would be better that the contractors were made a present of the price of the job, rather than have the work proceed. Heretofore Goderich has been noted for its healthfulness, and has gained a continental celebrity as a summer resort and sanitarium, and no greater injury to the town's good name and future prospects on this line could be done than to proceed with a work which will beyond question unfit the water for domestic use by bringing it in contact with pollutions from the harbor cesspool.

To the members of the town council we would now say it is time to call "Halt!" The people have put up with the botching of an undertaking that was originally believed to be in the sanitary interest; the reckless expenditure entailed by theorizing and experimenting on this great public work has also been borne with little or no complaint; but the time has now come to put a stop to the policy of imbecility which appears to have taken possession of our public stewards.

If the scheme is further proceeded with, the large amount expended will be worse than thrown away, for no householder would dare to take to his home pestilential water that must inevitably breed disease and death amongst those who surround his hearth. Water-takers have been advertised for by the council, but we believe the number will be very limited, if the mad project of running deadly poison through the pipes is persisted in.

As we write the whole country is horrified by the news that poisoned candy has been sent to a number of families through the public mails; some time ago it was discovered that an attempt was being made to introduce disease-infected clothing into the city of New York; but neither of these efforts can compare in criminality with the attempt that is now being made to introduce wholesale into the households of Goderich disease and death, through the medium of what was originally intended to be a pure water supply.

The infamous scheme must be stopped at once and forever.

In the hurry of getting up this article on "The Grant to the Oarsmen" last week we had not time to thoroughly examine the authorities on Mechanics' Institute and Agricultural and Arts grants. In looking into the matter we find that these grants are statutory, but none of the other donations to which we drew the attention of our readers come under that head.
