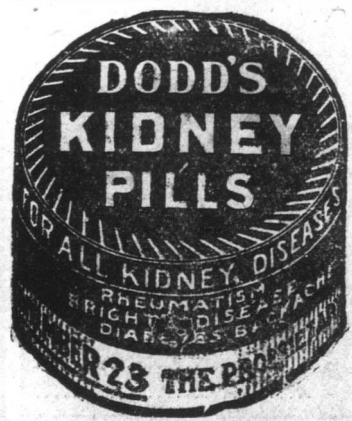

The Sealing Fleet.

Eight Ships Only This Season. Eight ships will prosecute the seal fishery this year, the Terra Nova, Eagle, Ranger, Viking, Diana, Seal, Thor's and Neptune. It is probable that all the sealing fleet will clear for the seal fishery from this port this spring, the idea of clearing from the Northward having been abandoned. Some very old ships will be amongst those going to the ice-fields this year, for it will be the 51st consecutive year for the Diana whilst S.S. Ranger celebrates her golden jubilee at the seal fishery. The following is a list of the older sealing steamers with some particulars concerning them:
