Treasures Are Sought in The City of David.

EXPLORERS HOPE TO FIND RELICS OF MILITARY VICTORIES.

London, June 29.—At the annual meeting of the Palestine Exploration Fund, Prof. MacAlister, who will have charge of the excavations in the City of David, declared that it was hoped to find treasures of the first magnitude and quite possibly monuments relating to King David's military victory.

Dr. Hogarth, presiding, said an invitation had been received from the Palestine department of antiquities to

take part with other societies in a thorough examination and eventual excavation of the Hill of Ophel at Jerusalem. Approximately six acres had been conceded to the fund for these purposes. The hill is south of Jerusalem and is accepted by modern scholars as the site of the original fortress which afterward became the City of David.

He is Mr. Arthur Vincent, and it is his boast that he has worked sixteen hours a day for twenty years. Every morning he awakes in his workshop carving out violins. Then at night he becomes the leader of the orchestra at His Majesty's Theatre.

Mr. Vincent's father was a violin-maker, and he was told as a boy that if he wanted an instrument he would have to make it himself.

Somme Memorial.

APPEAL FOR FUNDS FOR GREAT ALLIED SANCTUARY.

An appeal for funds to erect a great Allied War Memorial on the Somme is made by a committee, which includes the Earl of Balfour, the Earl of Derby, Viscount Milner, Earl Haig and Mr. Asquith. The memorial, states the appeal, will take the form of a great sanctuary outside Amiens, with side-chapels, wherein the names of the dead will be inscribed in golden books. Subscribers of 25 and over can have any one name they choose engraved in bronze on the walls.

"The French," the appeal concludes, "have already raised their share of the funds required, the Belgians a considerable portion of their share, and we are now asking for the contribution of the British Empire."

Cook young onion tops in boiling salted water add to white sauce, and serve on toast.
