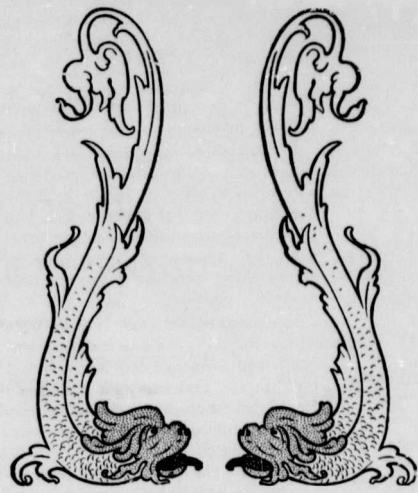

### CARDINAL'S WILL HAS NOT BEEN FOUND

Rome, Dec. 28.—All the evidence thus far adduced concerning the black box which was taken from the room of Cardinal Rampolla the day he died, tends to show the cardinal was fearful that it would be tampered with. The box, which is believed by some persons to have contained the last will and testament and other papers of Cardinal Rampolla, was placed under his pillow by the cardinal the day he was forced to take to his bed with the seizure which shortly afterward caused his death.

Soon after the cardinal passed away and while the body was being moved from the bed to be prepared for the coffin, the black box fell to the floor. Some persons picked it up and hid it on the cardinal's writing desk. Since that all is a mystery concerning the box. No one can be found who has seen it. Whether it disappeared before, during or after the stream of people were admitted to the death chamber to view the body, is not known.

Hope is still entertained that the person who appropriated the box is not interested in the suppression of the cardinal's will but carried the casket away in the belief that it contained valuables and will return the useless papers.

Negotiations are proceeding between the heirs of the late cardinal to see if it is not possible for them to reach an agreement for the disposition of the estate under the terms of the will made by Cardinal Rampolla in 1889.

### CANADA WILL HAVE LARGEST 'SCOPE' IN WORLD

Montreal, Dec. 28.—Much speculation has been aroused in Montreal over the site to be chosen for the world's largest telescope, the contract for the tube of which has just been let to the Warner, Swazey Co., of Cleveland.

It has been reported that the telescope was to be erected in Ottawa, but, according to Prof. McLeod, of McGill University, the site has not yet been fixed. It was, however, declared on good authority here, that Calgary may be chosen because it offers the clear sky which is desired by the astronomers. W. F. King, C.M.G., L.L.D., chief astronomer of the Department of the Interior, and superintendent of the Geodetic Survey of

Canada, is investigating the matter, taking into consideration atmospheric and other conditions that bear upon the usefulness of the great instrument. It is also said that a site in British Columbia may be selected.

Eighteen months will be required to build the tube and complete it for installation in the observatory, which will have to be erected to house it. The Warner and Swazey Co. built the Lick Telescope, which was finished in 1887, the object glass of which is 36 inches in diameter, and in 1893, the Yerkes telescope, which is the largest in the world, was completed with an object glass of 40 inches. The new telescope for the Canadian government will be twice the size of the Lick, having an object glass with a diameter of 72 inches.

The wonderful instrument will weigh at least 50 tons and will be poised on massive concrete piers. An automobile could be driven through it.

### Kitchen Range Blew Up

Regina, Dec. 26.—At the residence of R. Taylor a kitchen range blew up this afternoon crashing through the doors in small pieces, tearing the walls and floor and setting fire to the house. The explanation given is that the hot water tank exploded, due to clogged water pipes.
