**A NEW RECTORY
FOR BIRR CHURCH**

**Congregation at a Largely-At-
tended Meeting Decides to
Build at Once.**

The congregation of Trinity Church,
Birr, held a largely-attended meeting
on Friday night, at which some very
important business was transacted.
Mr. W. C. Hodgins was, on motion,
voted chairman, and Mr. Arthur D.
Scott, secretary.

Archdeacon Richardson, D. C. L.,
was present at the bishop's request,
and addressed the meeting on various
topics important to the parish pre-
paratory to the appointment of a rec-
tor. He paid a just tribute to the good
work being done by the congregation for
35 years, Rev. Robert Wilson, and in
conclusion he promised a united church
to whoever should be chosen to suc-
ceed him.

The matter of a new rectory was then
brought up, and the archdeacon point-
ed out the need and duty of providing
such a building without delay. Messrs.
D. Ashworth, F. J. Scott, N. Ryan, M.
Kohl, G. Ferguson, A. A. Neil and the
chairman all spoke in support of the
project, and pledged themselves to do
all in their power to help the project
along.

On motion of Mr. Ashworth, sec-
onded by Mr. F. Scott, it was resolved
"That we, the representatives of
Trinity Church, Birr, are prepared to
co-operate with the congregation of
St. George's Church in providing a
suitable rectory house for their parish,
and that this house be built within
three years."

As regards the minister's salary, it
was assumed that Trinity and St.
George's Churches will make up
the amount without difficulty.
The bishop is expected to fill this
vacancy at once.

**SURVIVED WIFE
BUT FOUR WEEKS**

**Death at Windsor of Lieut.-
Col. Guillot, a Well-Known
Officer.**

Lieut.-Col. James C. Guillot, one of
the most widely-known officers in the
London military district, died on Sat-
urday evening at his home on Quel-
lette avenue, Windsor.

The death of Lieut.-Col. Guillot was
not unexpected. He was first taken ill
about four years ago, and some time
since a complication developed, from
which it was apparent he could not
recover. As winter approached, his
condition rapidly deteriorated, and he
was obliged to resign his position as
city treasurer of Windsor.

Lieut.-Col. Guillot was born in Sand-
wich 59 years ago. He lived the whole
of his life in that place and in Win-
dors. For a number of years he was
accountant and a foremost wholesale
drug house in Detroit, but eleven years
ago he resigned his position to become
city treasurer of Windsor.

He was always a most promi-
nent part in military affairs. At the
time of the Fenian troubles he was a
member of the volunteers stationed on
the frontier at Windsor, and in recog-
nition of his services he received a
military five years ago. In 1885 he joined
the Twenty-first (Essex) Fusiliers
and held a full command of the
regiment for five years, and it was
largely owing to his efforts that the
corps occupied a foremost position
among the forces of London district.
Lieut.-Col. Guillot was a well-known
figure at the military camps on Car-
ling's Heights, where he appeared for
some years as commanding officer of
the Twenty-first and later as a mem-
ber of the divisional staff in connec-
tion with the death of Lieut.

Col. Guillot is the fact that Mrs. Guil-
lot (formerly Miss Helen Weaver),
died only four weeks ago. Lieut.-
Col. Guillot is survived by four chil-
dren: Dr. Harry Guillot, former
mayor of Pontiac, Mich.; Mrs. Van
Hook, of Pittsburgh, Pa.; Mrs. William
McCollig, of Windsor, and Miss Nellie
Guillot.

**Forbes Robertson Delights
Londoners at the Grand**

**Appeared in Esmond's Comedy-
Drama, "Love and the Man"**
—Story of the Play.

What was distinctly the event of the
season in the theatrical line took place
on Saturday, when Mr. Forbes Robert-
son, the eminent English actor, pre-
sented Henry V. Esmond's new play,
"Love and the Man." A large audience
in the evening, witnessed the drama
with intense enjoyment. The way in
which the play and Mr. Robertson were
received, showed that the theater-going
public of London thoroughly concurred
in the unanimous expression of approval
which greeted Mr. Robertson's inter-
pretation, when the play made its first
appearance three weeks ago in "Tory-
ism." The play a comedy-drama in five
acts, dealing with contemporary
English society, evinces in so many ex-
cellent and happy touches, the master-
ful grasp of human life, as its illus-
trious predecessor, "When We Were
Twenty-One." It is a comedy, and a
