ITURK TROOPS ATTEMPT TO RECAPTURE TRIPOLI

Italian Cruisers Assist Soldiers With Searchlight and Guns.

Tripoli, Oct. 11. — The Turks apparently do not intend to abandon Tripoli to the Italians without further determined resistance. For several days bands of horsemen have been hovering in the vicinity of Italian outposts.

Early yesterday morning a force of about 3,000 Turkish troops, with field guns, was discovered advancing in two columns, with the evident intention of recapturing the town. A large body of natives marched with the troops, and presented a formidable array. The Italian commander, however, had an intimation that such an attempt would probably be made, and his men were amply prepared.
