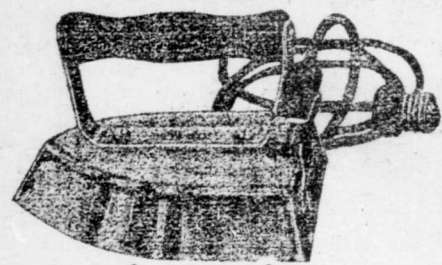

NON-JURY SITTINGS ENDED UNEXPECTEDLY

Two Cases Were Settled and the Third Was Postponed.

The non-jury sittings of the supreme court of Ontario opened Monday afternoon at 2:30 before Chief Justice W. R. Meredith at the courthouse. Although three cases were entered for trial the court was not called upon to give a decision in any one of the actions, as only one, Fuller against Bomis, et al., was commenced.

The action of Werry against Bell was postponed by an order of the local judge and was also transferred to St. Thomas. The parties in the suit of Harding against the London Canning Company reached a settlement, and the action was also transferred to St. Thomas. The evidence of the plaintiff in the remaining action was taken on Monday afternoon, and the hearing was to be continued on Tuesday, but the parties acted on the suggestion of the court and reached an amicable settlement.

ANECDOTE AND EULOGY OF BENCH AT BAR'S BANQUET

Members of Legal Profession Are "Learned Friends" in True Sense at Festive Board—J. H. Flock, K.C., Oldest Member, an Efficient Chairman.

An imposing array of legal talent gathered around the festive board in the Indian room of the Occidental Hotel Monday evening on the occasion of the third annual banquet of the Middlesex bar.

While the majesty of the law was by no means forgotten, there was little of that professional reserve which usually surrounds gentlemen of the legal profession, and the result was a famous flow of wit and anecdote connected with incidents in the past in which members of the Middlesex bar were involved.

Mr. J. H. Flock, K.C., was voted into the chair as being the oldest member of the bench. Justice MacBeth, who presided at the banquet, was the secretary. Mr. U. A. Buchner, read the eulogy of a case in which Justice W. R. Meredith and Sir Geo. Gibbons, who were unable to be present.

After proposing the toast to the King, which was heartily responded to, the chairman proposed a toast to the bench. "It is the right to be proud of our judiciary," he said. "Whatever Government is in power, they always try to select the men best fitted to serve on the bench. Many of our county judges are well fitted to take higher duties."

He expressed the opinion that the judicial system of Canada was better than that of the United States. "Our judges know that they are on their good behavior," he said, "I know of only one attempt to bribe a Canadian judge, and that failed."

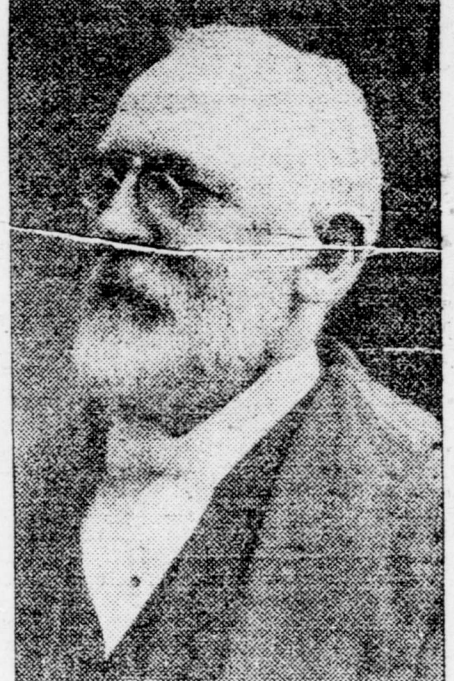

WILD WOMEN TURN TO BOATHOUSES

The Suffragette "Arson Squad" Busy in the Suburbs of Birmingham.

MRS. BELMONT WARNS

American Suffragist Leader Says Militant Methods May Come to the United States.

London, April 22.—An "Arson squad" of militant suffragettes succeeded during the night in burning down the Handsworth Park boathouse in a Birmingham suburb. Four pleasure boats and a large quantity of equipment were destroyed.

With the opening of the boating season attempts to destroy skiffs and shells are expected, and along most of the rivers and close water, a kept by special patrol night and day for suffragettes bent on destruction.
