The Methodists, too, are moving in the direction of a complete agglemeration of all the various branches holding one common bra doitummos commos and ishan cheers jurisdiction. In pursuance of this object, a highly important and interesting meeting was held last mouth at Toronto, at which the five distinct branches of Methodism were represented viz, Weslevan, Episcopal, New Con-nection, Primitive, Biole Christians. Of these the Wesleyans are by far the most numerous, greatly inexcess of all the others put together. At the meeting the Hon Mr Aikins presided, and the Rev Dr Evans, well known bere, took an active part. It is anderstood that the proceedings were such as to encourage the hope of an early consum-mation of the object of the movement.
