Cold Storage for Apples Abroad

THE American shipper of fruit has one great advantage in the European market, from the fact that comparatively little is known abroad about the storage of fruit. Even in the case of apples, no provision had been made on the other side of the water for their preservation. It has been found necessary to store them on this side and to ship them to London or Paris, where they find a ready market.

In Germany, where a most jealous disposition is shown to the importation of American apples, efforts are now being made to exclude American fresh fruit by means of discriminating tariffs. The German government seems to be back of this scheme. This need not worry the American fruit growers. as France, England and Ireland will be able to take care of all fruit exported from the United States for some years to come.—Cold Storage.
