Southern Manitoba, at present, presents the most singular appearance ever shown by any country at this season of the year. There are thousands of grain stacks still standing and thousands of acres still covered by stacks that have been in the fields since last harvest. Some of these will be threshed and some burned to clear the ground for another crop. It is difficult to say what will become of the wheat. There is, at present, no market whatever for grain and much of that threshed during the winter and stored in the farmers' granaries is in danger of heating and will be a total loss should the heavy rains set in as usual in the early summer. Further damage may be expected.
