immediate consideration to the development of a national policy with regard to truck transportation that will allow for the movement of goods from one province of Canada to other provinces of Canada without trucking firms and manufacturers facing prohibitive costs associated with licensing, gas taxes and permits which could be eliminated through the issuing of federal licenses for interprovincial carriers.—(Notice of Motion No. 4).

And debate arising thereon;
