

Page 1, line 16. For "La Mercantile Compagnie d'Assurance contre le Feu" substitute "La Compagnie d'Assurance Canadienne Mercantile".

Page 2, line 34. After "leakage," insert "insurance".

Page 3, line 3. For "time," substitute "period".

Page 4, line 13. After "reserve" insert "fund".

Page 4, line 20. For "cent" substitute "centum".

Page 4, lines 21 to 28, inclusive. For subclause (6) substitute the following:—

"(6) Notice of the total amount of assessments on deposit notes to be paid in any year shall be given in the form provided by the by-laws of the Company by a circular mailed by registered post to each member."

Page 4, lines 29 to 31, inclusive. Leave out the whole of subclause seven.

Page 5, line 1. For "of" substitute "on".

Page 5, line 28. Insert the following as subclause (4):—

"(4) This section shall apply only to bankruptcies of policyholders occurring in the province of Quebec."

Page 5, line 38. After "shall be" insert "*prima facie*".

Page 7, line 18. For "licence" substitute "certificate of registry".

In the Title

For "An Act to incorporate The Mercantile Fire Insurance Company," substitute "An Act to incorporate The Canadian Mercantile Insurance Company."

Ordered, That the said amendments be taken into consideration at the next sitting of the Senate.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk with a Bill (82), intituled: "An Act for granting to His Majesty certain sums of money for the public service of the financial year ending the 31st March, 1937," to which they desire the concurrence of the Senate.

The said Bill was read the first time, and—

With leave of the Senate,

The said Bill was then read the second and third times.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That a Message be sent to the House of Commons to acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill (2), intituled: "An Act to amend the Precious Metals Marking Act, 1928," was read the third time.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That a Message be sent to the House of Commons to acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, without any amendment.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill (73), intituled: "An Act to authorize the provision of moneys to meet certain expenditures made and indebtedness incurred by the Canadian National Railways during the calendar year 1937, and to authorize the guarantee by His Majesty of certain securities to be issued by the Canadian National Railways," was read the third time.
