CANADIAN WHEAT BOARD

ADVISABILITY OF BALLOT WITH RESPECT TO PAYMENT OF MEMBERSHIP DUES

On the order:

Mr. Decore—The following proposed resolution: That, in the opinion of this house, the government should consider the advisability of empowering the Canadian wheat board to conduct a ballot, by mail, of the grain producers holding permit books to ascertain the wishes of such producers as to the wheat board complying with orders signed by such producers directing the wheat board to pay membership dues to farm organizations from money due such producers from the sale of their grain by the wheat board.
