Mr. Caron: Mr. Speaker, on a point of order, Nixon I submit that if the minister wants to go ahead he needs unanimous consent.

Some hon. Members: Sit down.

Mr. Speaker: Order. I was not really hearing the minister on the question of privilege. I gave him the opportunity to make his correction. I take it he is now satisfied that he has corrected the error.

Mr. Rouleau: He is never satisfied.

Mr. Speaker: It being 9.45 o'clock it is my duty, pursuant to section 5 of standing order 58, to interrupt these proceedings and put forthwith the question on the amendment now before the house.

The house divided on the amendment (Mr. Benidickson) which was negatived on the following division:

(The following occurred before the recording of the vote)

Mr. Diefenbaker: Mr. Speaker, may I rise at this time to make a rather unusual request. I do not believe the rules forbid anyone who has voted leaving the house thereafter, but naturally we do not follow that course because of the difficulties that would ensue if each and every one of us were to do so. In view of the fact the Minister of Finance (Mr. Fleming) has an appointment at 10.30, I suggest that the house will understand if he leaves.

Mr. Speaker: The house can, by unanimous consent, endorse any irregularity. I take it that the house is in a mood to give the hon. Minister of Finance leave to leave.

Mr. Pearson: I think the minister ought to be allowed to leave.

Mr. Speaker: I would not want the house to be under any misapprehension about the rule because subsection (2) of standing order 12 says:

When Mr. Speaker is putting a question, no member shall enter, walk out of or across the house, or make any noise or disturbance.
