PRAYERS.

A Message was received from the Senate informing this House that the Senate had passed the following Bill, to which the concurrence of this House was desired:

Bill No. 340 (Letter F-11 of the Senate), intituled: "An Act respecting Canadian Nurses' Association".

Mr. Pickersgill, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Order of the House of February 15, 1954, for a Return showing:—

1. Were the 3,439 Cooney rifles, which were sold for \$6,018.25, according to page 24 of the 9th Annual Report of the Crown Assets Disposal Corporation, new or used?

2. What was the original price paid by the Government for these .22 rifles?

3. For what reasons were they declared surplus?

4. To how many companies were invitations for offers sent, in connection with the sale of these assets?

Mr. Gardiner, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Order of the House of February 24, 1954, for a Return showing:—How much money has been spent by the Federal Government in Prince Edward Island since 1946 in connection with the experimental station at Charlottetown and other illustrative stations in the province, including rentals and salaries of personnel?
