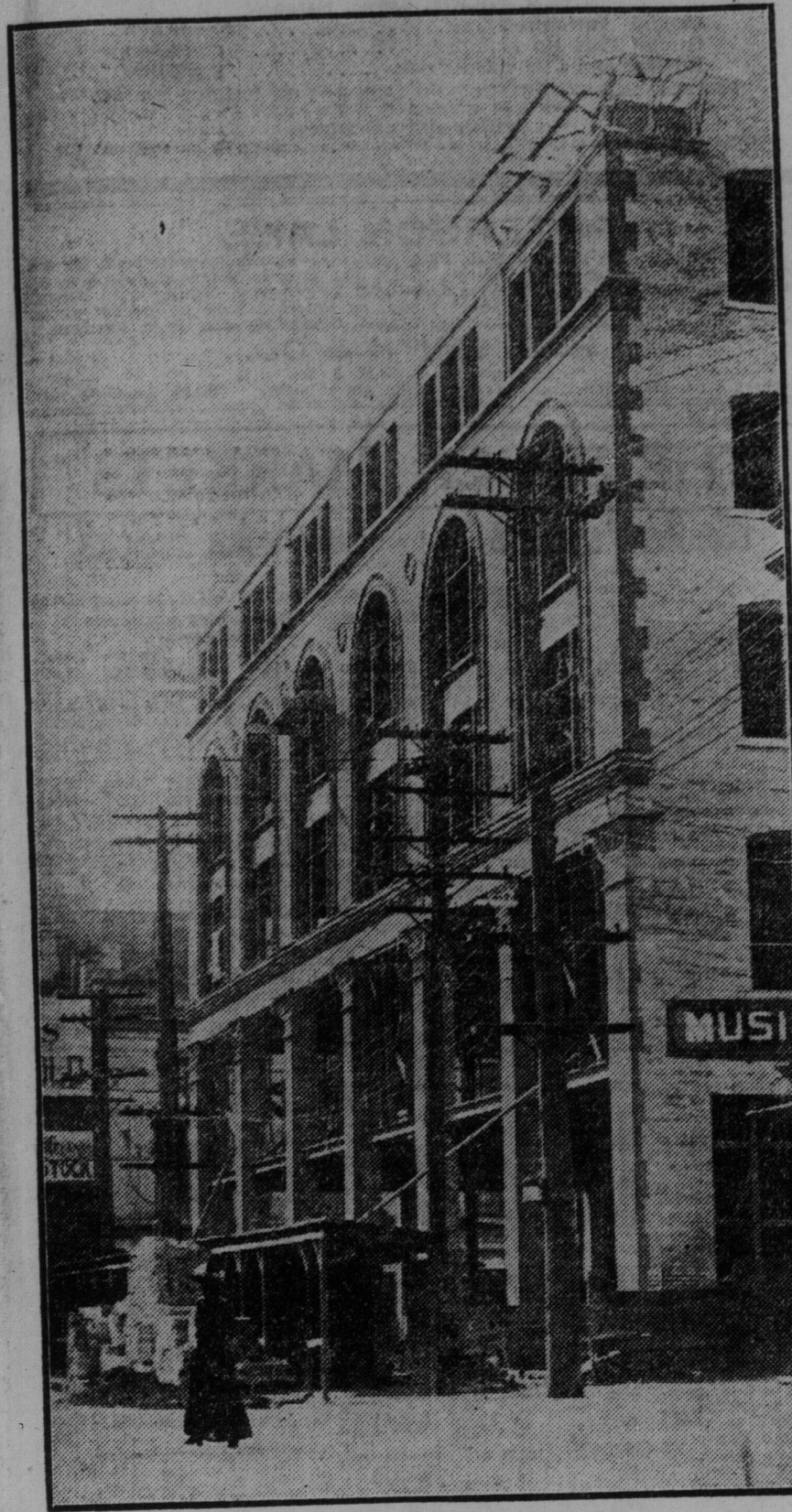


THE NEW RYRIE BUILDING

SITE FOR NEW HOME FOR GIRLS

Jarvis Street Property Bought at Thirty Thousand by Fred Victor Mission.

Two semi-detached houses have been purchased by the Fred Victor Mission and they will be turned into a new home for girls. The property purchased was the three-storey houses at 341 and 343 Jarvis street and the price was \$30,000. There is a frontage of 56 feet and a depth of 225 feet. The new home will have forty rooms. Goulding & Hamilton negotiated the deal.

PLANS PASSED FOR MOORE PARK SCHOOL

Toronto's School Outside of City Limits to Cost Eighty Thousand Dollars.

Plans for the erection of the new high school in Moore Park have been passed by the city architect's department. The new school will be located on Alice street near Humberwood, and will cost \$80,000, exclusive of the site. Considerable difficulty was encountered by the board of education in securing a suitable site for the building and as none were available inside the city limits they were forced to purchase this property outside.

SITE FOR FACTORY HAS BEEN PURCHASED

The northwest corner of Noble street and Strickland place has been purchased by H. L. Wood & Co. who intend to erect a factory on the property. T. Brinkley was the owner and A. R. Morton & Co. put thru the deal.

Sidney Township Farmer Sui-cides on Anniversary of Wife's Funeral.

VICTIM LEFT A NOTE

"You Will Find My Body Near the Well in the Lane."

BELLEVILLE, Sept. 16.—(Special.)—Louis Juby, aged 35 years, a farmer residing in Sidney Township, yesterday committed suicide by shooting himself. In the afternoon a relative found a note tacked upon the stable door, which read as follows: "Seeing nothing ahead but work and trouble, you will find my body near the well in the lane." An immediate investigation resulted in the finding of Juby's body at the place indicated by the note. The unfortunate man and, at a moment of mental aberration, taken his life. The weapon used to commit the deed was a single barrel shotgun, which Juby had placed in such a position that upon being discharged the contents had virtually blown the top of his head off. Death had been instantaneous. The victim's wife was buried a year ago on the date he took his life. Two young sons survive. Juby was in comfortable circumstances and apparently in his usual health and mind on the morning of the tragedy.

PLANS OF SURVEY WERE CONSIDERED

Permanent Committee Appointed to Take Charge of the Scheme.

The committee of citizens supporting the proposed survey of the civic administration in Toronto met at the National Club yesterday afternoon and passed upon the proposal to be submitted to the board of control and later to the city council.

In order that the proposals might come before the council on Sept. 29 it was decided to have them presented to the board of control on Sept. 26. John Macdonald, J. P. Hyman, J. F. H. Gooderham, F. W. C. S. Blackwell, R. Parker and W. J. Barry were appointed a permanent committee to take charge of the survey, and they will also form a deputation to wait on the board of control when the proposal is submitted. An effort will be made to induce Sir Edmund Osler to say a few words on behalf of the citizens committee when the large deputation waits upon the city council.

STOLEN PEARLS RECOVERED.

Workman Finds Them Almost Entire Lying in Heap on Sidewalk.

LONDON, Sept. 16.—(Can. Press.)—A workman this morning found on a sidewalk practically the entire pearl necklace valued at \$650,000, which was stolen on July 16, while in transit by mail from Paris to London. The man was going to work in Highbury a northern district of London, when he noticed the pearls lying in a heap. He found them were 58. He took them to the nearest police station, where they were at once recognized. Only one pearl is now missing. On Sept. 2, three Englishmen and two Austrians were arrested when trying to dispose of some of the pearls in London. They were believed by the police to belong to a notorious international gang of thieves.

POURED KEROSENE ON FIRE.

Dorchester Young Girl Probably Burned Fatally Through Explosion.

LONDON, Ont. Sept. 16.—(Can. Press.)—Hazel, a young girl of Dorchester, was terribly burned this morning through an explosion caused by pouring kerosene on a fire. She was stung on the upper part of her body and face while her hair was completely burned off. Her recovery is doubtful.

FISHERIES ARE FLOURISHING

OTTAWA, Sept. 16.—According to statistics compiled by the customs department and issued today by Hon. J. D. Reid, the Canadian fishing industry is in a most flourishing condition. The exports for the first four months of the present fiscal year for the four main domestic fish for the first four months of the year were \$2,140,000 for the corresponding period of last year. There is a slight falling off, however, in the exports of salmon and their produce. For the first four months of the fiscal year \$13,629,000 were exported, as against \$13,629,000 for the same period of 1912.

TEAM RAN AWAY DRIVER KILLED

English Farm Hand's Tragic Fate While Drawing Stone Near Westport.

BROCKVILLE, Sept. 16.—(Special.)—George Moulton, aged 32 years, who today under tragic circumstances half a mile from the village of Westport, Monaghan, with other teamsters, was engaged drawing stone from the government quarry to the new wharf at Westport. When about a mile out the team became frightened and ran away. In attempting to stop them, Moulton in some manner fell from his seat and became entangled in the wagon behind the heels of the frightened animal. He received such injuries that he lived only half an hour. Moulton came from England three months ago.

TO HAVE EQUAL SUFFRAGE.

Dutch Women Will Shortly Get Right to Parliamentary Vote.

THE HAGUE, Netherlands, Sept. 16.—(Can. Press.)—There is every indication that women will shortly be given the parliamentary franchise in Holland, as in the opening of the states general today the new Dutch cabinet states its intention of granting the vote to women. The speech from the throne says that a bill is to be introduced removing the constitutional obstacles in the way of granting the suffrage to women.
