STREET RAILWAY TRACKS The New Ones Said to Interfere With Safe Traffic.

The relaying of the tracks along Kingstreet will be commenced at once, the work to begin from the west of the south track. The route of the westbound ears will not be affected, but the eastbound King cars will go down Bathurst to Front-street, and up York to King again. Eastbound Belt cars will probably run via Queen, York and Front-

streets to Sherbourne. H. S.
