STREET RAILWAY TRACKS.

The New One's Said to Interfere
With Safe Traffic.
The relaying of the tracks along King-
street will be commenced at once, the
work to begin from the west of the
south track. The route of the west-
bound cars will not be affected, but the
eastbound King cars will go down Bath-
urst to Front-streets and up York to
King again. Eastbound Belt cars will
probably run via Queen, York and Front-
streets to Sherbourne.

H. S. Powlby, who does considerable
diving, stated to The World that the
new rails being laid are about three
quarters to an inch higher than the
old, and what rails have already
been laid have been placed on the old
road bed, which, consequently, makes
the top of the rail the above stated dif-
ference higher. This renders it dan-
gerous for horses, and to make the
traffic safe and with the same as
before the roadbed should be lowered
as much as the new rails are higher
than the old.
