If it hadn't been for the fight put up by

The World against the spoliation of Yonge-

street by the C.P.R. and the Metropolitan Rail-

way Companies, the steel would have been

effectuated. This morning cars would be run-

ning from the one system to the other, and

Yonge-street would have passed into the

possession and under the jurisdiction of

the C.P.R. and the Metropolitan Railway Com-

pany. The World was practically alone in this

fight for the supremacy of provincial and

municipal rights, as against the usurped

authority of the Railway Committee. An

incredible feature of the controversy was

the attitude of the corporation officials and

aldermen. As the case stands to-day, the

city legally appears as a consenting party

to the order of the committee, under which

the Metropolitan proceeded on Saturday

night to make a connection between its

tracks and the C.P.R. system. Who will

be to shoulder the responsibility for this

criminal negligence and treachery will

be a subject for future discussion in the

Council Chamber. In the meantime the

case is in court, and the city's immediate

business is to prosecute it there with all

the resources at its command. When the

deputation returned from Ottawa there was

no one except The World to expose the

treachery of those who had betrayed the

city in their keeping. Now everyone

seems to have grasped the importance of

contesting the Railway Committee's order.
