### MINES AND MINING STOCKS.

Encouraging Review of the Situation in Rossland Camp From the Rossland Miner.

### RE CENTRAL CANADA MINING.

Address Delivered in Winnipeg—Sales on Three Canadian Mining Exchanges.

In its regular weekly review of developments in the camp The Rossland Miner of May 12 says:

"The most interesting trend of the past week in mining circles is the way the surface and on the Velvet is improving. This discovery was made some days since while excavating for a stable, and is 100 feet to the southeast of the shaft house. The ledge is a wide one, with well defined walls, and the pebbles are true and sure vein. The vein was found under a thin covering of alluvium, and on the surface gave returns of 80 to 100 tons, but now at a depth of 20 feet it assays as high as \$120 to the ton. This makes it one of the richest finds that have yet been made in the Traflet Creek division. It is true that pockets of free gold ore have been found in the X, but the amount is considerably less than this find in the Velvet, but when it is considered that the latter mine has been producing gold for some time, and that the copper ore is the importance of so rich a find will be appreciated by mining men. It brings the Velvet within almost the range of a bonanza mine, and there is no telling at the present stage of its development what its possibilities are when it has mines to be opened to a depth of 100 or 200 feet."

"The fact that the Velvet has smashed all previous records by sending over 244 tons to the smelter last week shows the possibilities of this mine when it is equipped with machinery up to the limit of its capacity. The Velvet never looked better, and under the very expert management that is now guiding its affairs it is certain that a record for itself much larger than that last week."

"The Evening Star is developing in a most satisfactory manner. The manager, Mr. J. H. McLean, has secured a 300-horse-power compressor, and as it will take several months to fill this order it has been decided to lease a power plant so that development may be proceeded with in the interim. The seven-drill compressor, which has been secured, will be added to the existing force of drills."

"Engineers of the Red Mountain Railway are now locating the spur of the main track which will run to the foot of the Jodie and No. 1 tunnel, and the Nickel Plate mine. Just as soon as the compressor is in place on the Black Bear flat regular shipments will be undertaken from both of the West Lake properties. It is, however, probable that some shipments will be made from the Jodie before the compressor is installed, also, as stated, the regular output cannot be begun until all the proper facilities are at hand. The Nickel Plate, however, should ship in any case within two months from date, allowing ample time for the spur, which is of no great length, to be completed."

"The showing on the Annie, which it will be remembered is also a test of the values on the north vein of the Red Mountain property itself, is still exceptionally good. Assays taken yesterday showed 3 ozs. gold and 6 per cent. copper, or a total value of something over \$80 per ton. The ledge itself is maintaining its width as depth is gained, being about 400 feet wide."

"On the Iron Mask the country between the main and north veins on the 400 foot level is proving exceptionally rich and is being mined. A new vein was located the week before last north of the main ledge, which was some ten feet wide, and has just been panned, proving 20 feet across. The north vein will be located within the next few feet, and thus the barren country which was expected has proved to be a very high mineralized stretch."

**Central Canada v. Transvaal.**  
Following is an address given at the Winnipeg City Hall by Mr. E. H. Macdonald, president of the Central Canada Chamber of Commerce and Development Co., Limited, to the members of the Central Canada Chamber of Mines:

From published statistics it will be noted that the Transvaal ores are low grade, averaging only 0.5 ozs. to the ton, over the plates, in value slightly over \$8 per ton. The mines are deep, averaging 2500 feet, some exceeding 4000 feet. The cost of concentrating these enormous dumps averages about \$50,000, and sinking and equipping a shaft to that depth about \$200,000, or \$150,000. All this has to be spent before they are on the same basis as a Canadian outcrop mine, when the first pick is put into the ore.

The Transvaal reefs average 10 feet in thickness. In Canada a fair average reef is four feet, but many run in thickness up to 25 feet. Average returns from Lake of the Woods mines now working would give about \$15 to the ton, much higher than the Transvaal. Large outcrop reefs returning 30 per ton upwards are common in Ontario, which might be worked as quarries. The cost of mining and milling the latter with modern appliances (as on the Hand) should not exceed \$150 per ton.

Labor is considerably higher in Africa, averaging for white labor \$8 per day, Kaffir labor being \$17 per month and found. All necessities of life are much more expensive in Africa and a workman's three-roomed cottage cannot be obtained in Johannesburg under \$35 per month.

Transvaal mines are highly capitalized.
