

Barr, it is claimed, represented himself to the holders of the land as the Government agent, and offered them \$8 an acre, stating at the time that if they did not take that amount the land would be taken from them by expropriation at a lower price. At the same time, the allegation persists, he had the Government agreement to give him \$12 an acre for the entire 17,000 acres.

Barr Sold His Own Land.

Counsel A. Rives Hall, K.C., submitted the position of some of the applicants at the foregoing trial, as follows:

In view of the circumstance that the result of the Dominion elections, as finally settled by the soldiers' vote, will not be known for some time yet, and that parliament cannot be called until the members are gazetted, it is now suggested here that the Dominion House may not meet until after Good Friday, which falls this year on March 29. Should the Government decide to give the members the customary 30 days' notice, parliament could not convene until shortly after the

Get Program Ready.

It is understood that the consensus of opinion among cabinet ministers is that time would be saved by having the sessional program well matured before House meets. The most serious obstacle in the way of this plan arises from the fact that the fiscal year closes on March 31, when most of the departments will be out of funds. With the estimates ready, however, a supply bill could be voted as soon as the debate on the address is concluded. On the other hand, it may be decided to cut down the usual time notice to members and call parliament for the middle of March.
