

The request could not be granted because the capacity at the jail will not permit any number of maitary prisoners. At present there are 38 prisoners at the jail, which has only a total accommodation of 55. Seven cells alone are given up to Higgins Hughes, who occupies one entire ward because of tuberculosis. The decision to segregate him was made some weeks ago at the earnest protests of other prisoners, who demanded ke be removed to a separate ward in order to reduce the chances of contagion in the jail.

Major Weekes made the request for a detention ward at the jail because, he claimed, it would facilitate trials of men who were to be brought into the civil court on charges of desertion and breaches of the military service act.
