Can Eggs Be Shipped.

Canada last year exported 200,000 cases of eggs to Great Britain. This year the prospects for export trade are slight. The freight has gone up 100 per cent, and other difficulties have entered into the situation. The merchants talked the question over at some length, and Mr. Silverwood will go to Montreal to endeavor to get assurances that produce can be shipped to Great Britain. The matter of cases was taken up. The matter of cases was taken up. These have risen from 30 cents to 45 cents a case, and as these have been supplied by the wholesale dealers, it was decided to call in the broken-down cases and replace them with newer and better cases.

The dealers will buy on the strictest basis from the farmers and small merchants. There is a great loss annually on bad eggs, and the "hen fruit" will be closely examined before shipment in order that the dealers may not have to bear all the loss. The farmers will be asked to gather their eggs daily, so that the loss will be minimized. Eliminate Bad Eggs.

The military authorities are investigating the circumstances in connection with the refusal of five London doctors to respond to a call of a returned soldier who was taken suddenly ill at the Grigg. House on Wednesday night last. Pte. Carmichael, who received a wound that afterwards required medical attention, was seized with severe pains and called to guests to summon a doctor. Although five were called all refused to go, according to the story told by the guests, unless the fee was guaranteed.

To the fifth doctor it was finally explained that the man's life was in danger, but still he is said to have demurred until the guests guaranteed the fee.


