4000 TROOPS NOW PREPARE MURDER
ILLINOIS CAPITAL

Terribly Inhuman Scenes Witnessed
in Streets, Where Race Rioters
Shoot, Burn and Pillage ---
Colored Population Flee in
Terror From City.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Aug. 16.—Order
has been maintained to-day in this,
the capital of the state, only by the
presence of 4000 armed soldiers.

His appearance was greeted by a
