lead for the first quarter in 23½ seconds. But Ogden was lapped on his older antagonist, and at the half, run in 47½, showed half a length in front. The rest of the way Ogden held the three-year-old safe, and won the trial by two lengths in 1:13½ for the six furlongs and one but the stable people and bluff old Puckett, the trade superintendent, saw the trial, and all hands were much impressed.

Ogden and his stable companions were shipped south that day and joined the rest of the day's horses at Sheepshead Bay, where Matt Byrnes was in charge. The latter had Scottish Chieftain in the Futurity, with the crack jockey, Fred Taral, up, and when he saw Ogden, which was rather under the shadow of Campbell's second about his little brown broncho.

But when Campbell planned him down to a bet of a half of a dollar, that his "broncho" would come in ahead of Scottish Chieftain, the man who had trained three Suburban winners, began to think. Campbell had something "on" him. After the race he was sure of it. Such a crowd was at Sheepshead Bay on the day of the Futurity that it was a matter of difficulty to get inside the betting line, except at the interval on the track side of the enclosure. So when Marcus Daly's commission, John E. McDonald and two others, started in with \$10,000 each to back Ogden, they had trouble from the outset.

Current (R. Schaefer) favored at 2 to 1, with Keene's Rhodessa (Simms) rated as second choice. The odds on Ogden were 10 to 1. In one or two cases, where moderate prices were laid on the Futurity for a place, they were 10 to 1 on Ogden for the place. On down the ring, here and there, a crowd of people were gathered, and they hurried the Daly commissioners, betting \$200 here, \$1000 there, until \$5 to \$10,000 had been obtained.

When the cry of "they're off" stopped further betting, the kickers, had as usual, raised a cloud of dust, and the crowd, in spite of all his jockey, Tod Sloan, could do nothing to prevent the crowd from getting in. The crowd was kept buster margin and Tuberville was kept buster margin. When they did get off, it was Orman and Ogden all the way. The Daly's commission were not to be outdone. They placed enough of the big wagers to win \$10,000. They were several days collecting the money and some of the jockeys were badly cramped to make good.

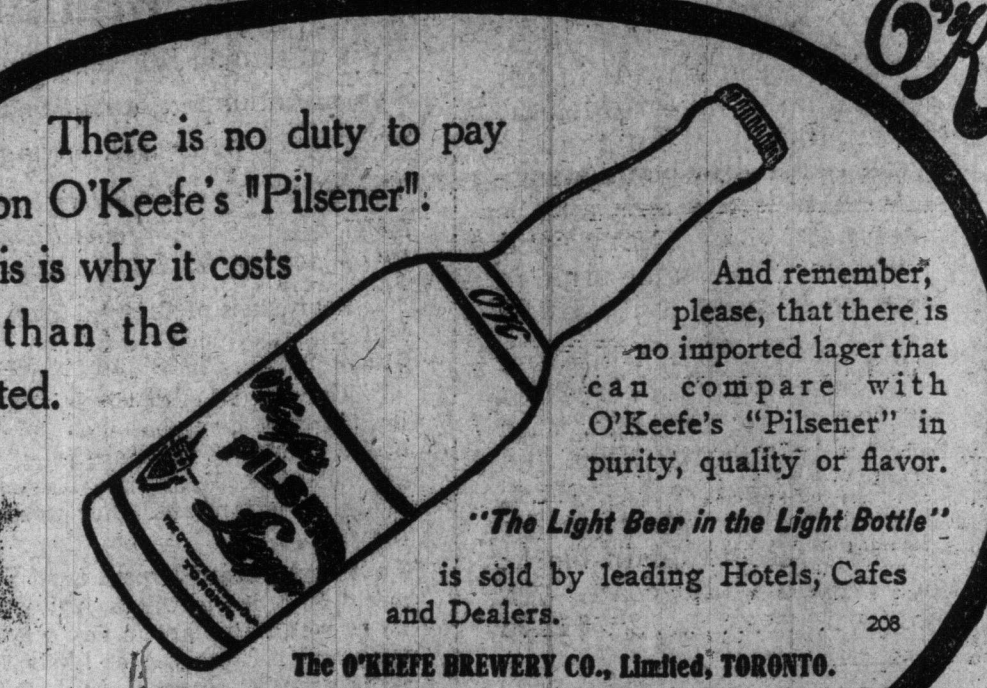
