JAPS LOST 20,000 MEN.

This the Russian Claim in Report of Four Days' Fight for Post which Japs had Taken.

Choo, Oct. 3.—2 p. m.—An official report from General Stoesse, dated Sept. 23, reached Choo on Oct. 2, confirming a previous report of the capture of the Japanese on Port Arthur. It began Sept. 22 and ended Sept. 23. The fighting was of an extremely severe character. The Japanese having retired General Stoesse issued the following proclamation: "Glory, Thanks to God, glory to our heroic garrison, glory to the Russian army, glory to the Russian navy. Thanks to our valiant volunteers who routed the enemy from the trenches, destroying them. God has permitted us to repulse the enemy. Praise to God. The volunteers referred to by General Stoesse were made up of General called upon to take a high hill which had been captured by the Japanese. From semi-official sources, it is learned that the attack began on the 19th along the whole line and lasted four days various positions changing hands many times. The high hill mentioned was a very important position to the Russians. The Japanese attacked repeatedly and were repulsed. Finally occupying the position on the night of Sept. 22 after suffering very severe losses. The attempt to recapture this hill being extremely hazardous. General Stoesse refused to issue the order, but called for volunteers. Everybody called upon responded, whereupon a requisition number of men were selected, leaving their families and property. The soldiers and officers alike carried grenades (explosive shells) weighing from two to six pounds which are thrown by hand and with these they attacked the Japanese temporary fortifications and drove the latter from all their positions. HON. D. A. MAC KINNON P. E.'S. NEW GOVERNOR.

His Appointment Formally Announced in Ottawa—It Was Not Unexpected.

Ottawa, Oct. 3.—(Special)—Hon. Donald Alexander MacKinnon, representative of the last Dominion parliament has been appointed lieutenant governor of Prince Edward Island. Donald Alexander MacKinnon, L.L.B., K. C., is the son of William MacKinnon, a Scotchman, and is of Scotch descent, and was born at Uigg, P. E. I., Feb. 21, 1868. He was educated at the Uigg grammar school, Prince of Wales College and Dalhousie University. He was admitted to the bar in 1887 and appointed a Q. C. in 1900. He was elected to the House of Representatives in 1903, and again in 1907, and was appointed again in 1909. In 1900 he was elected to the house of commons. The election was held on Feb. 1, 1901, and MacKinnon was re-elected. Lieut. Gov. MacKinnon was married in 1892 to Miss Owen of Georgetown, P. E. I.

DR. RUSSELL GOES TO SUPREME BENCH

Member For Hants Appointed a Judge of Supreme Court of Nova Scotia.

Ottawa, Oct. 3.—Dr. Benjamin Russell, M. P., who represented Hants county in the last parliament has been appointed to the Supreme Court bench of Nova Scotia. He has been made a puisne judge and the question will be decided later. Dr. Russell entered federal politics in 1896 when he was elected to the House of Commons. He has since been a member of the House of Commons. He was born in Dartmouth, N. S., on Jan. 10, 1849 and was educated at the Halifax grammar school and McGill University. He took his B. A. in 1868, M. A. in 1871 and D. C. L. in 1893. He was called to the bar of Nova Scotia in 1872 and was appointed a Q. C. in 1880. Since 1875 he has been one of the law reporters of the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia and is also a professor and lecturer in Dalhousie University Law school. For many years he was official reporter to the N. S. legislature. He is the recorder of the town of Lunenburg and was also a town councillor there. In Sept. '72 he married Miss Louise Coleman daughter of Capt. Coleman. He was first elected for the city of Halifax. He at once took a permanent interest in and taken over the Hants county seat.
