The general distress which prevailed in Europe and the United States had a tendency to make business less active in Canada, and work was not as plentiful as usual, and although we did not have a panic yet times in general were very hard, and there were a great many who were out of employment. In Toronto we had our share of the general depression, and consequently we had to relieve a large number of resident poor, most of whom were really deserving of your bounty, and the relief given enabled them, in some measure, to tide over a long winter.
