FIVE DROWNED WHEN SMACK OVERTURNS

A small fishing smack owned by Jean Hachey, of Isle Lemeque, N. B., was overturned in a heavy sea on Wednesday of this week, and the owner with his small son and three other men were drowned. The bodies of all were found in the cabin when, after the storm, the small craft was found tossed up on the beach at Tabusintac. The little ship had been sighted from shore the previous day, but rescue was impossible, owing to the raging fury of the storm. The other bodies are as yet unidentified.

Drowned at Sea. Fred McLaughlin was swept from the schooner Job, New York to Yarmouth, and drowned on June 21. He was twenty-two years old and belonged to Yarmouth.
