

C. N. R. CHIEF FAVORS NATIONALIZATION OF PORT OF SAINT JOHN

Declares at Trade Board Dinner Harbor Belongs to Whole of Canada—Sees Canada on Threshold of Prosperity

IF THE opinion of Sir Henry Thornton, president of the Canadian National Railways is any criterion, Canada now stands on the threshold of the greatest opportunity that has ever faced any country.

Speaking last night at the New Brunswick dinner given by the Saint John Board of Trade to the visiting delegates attending the first annual convention of the Canadian Board of Trade, at the Admiral Beatty Hotel, Sir Henry declared that Canada could not avoid prosperity.

"We got to have it," he said, "whether we like it or not."

Sir Henry also came out plain blank in favor of the nationalization of the port of Saint John under the administration of a harbor commission, adding that the port belonged not to Saint John nor the Maritimes, but to the whole of Canada.

He also stressed the importance of the national viewpoint of the affairs of the Canadian Board of Trade, rather than confining them to sectional differences and promised the hearty co-operation of the National Railways in the undertaking of the new organization.

He also advised the formation of a committee on transportation to discuss with the two great rail systems of Canada matters pertaining to this subject.

Lewis W. Simms, president of the Saint John Board of Trade, which was the host, was the chairman. Seated on his right hand was the guest of the evening, Sir Henry Thornton, and on his left Lieut.-Gov. Todd.

NEW BRUNSWICK ON MENU. New Brunswick was featured strongly on the menu, the various edibles being products of the province.
