Tokio Is Rocked By 64 Earthquakes Within Two Weeks

Dr. Omori, Authority on Upheavals, Assures Residents No Real Danger.

Tokio, June 27.—(A. P. by Mail)—Tokio had a surfeit of earthquakes during June. Between the second and fourth of the month, sixty-four were recorded on the seismograph, many of them of sufficient force to awaken the hardened citizens of the capital and send them scurrying under their desks, which are considered the safest places when another earth decides to readjust itself. Most of these shocks originated in Kashiwa Bay, which is in the earthquake zone, and fortunately did no damage.

Dr. Fusakichi Omori, authority on earthquakes and volcanoes, has assured the people that, despite the recent restlessness of the earth, which will continue for some time, Tokyo is a region comparatively free from danger. The shape and formation of Japan, according to Dr. Omori, make it peculiarly susceptible to underground disturbances. The volcanic zone lies along the inner Japan Sea side of the island, with an offshoot at right angles in the direction of Mount Fuji. The earthquake zone lies along the outer, Pacific slope of Japan—the border of the Pacific on all sides being the scene of greatest earthquakes.

The superstitious believe that Japan rests on a huge fish and earthquakes are caused by this fish becoming restless.

PLAN DINNER AT THE UNION CLUB

Entertainment for Forestry Visitors—Leaving for Maritimes Today.

The committee having in charge the matter of entertainment for the visiting members of the British Forestry Association met yesterday afternoon and decided to tender them a dinner at the Union Club on Wednesday evening. Mayor Fisher and G. E. Barbour, president of the Board of Trade, were named as a reception committee to meet the visitors on their arrival here and extend a welcome to the city.

The party will arrive in the city early on Wednesday morning and leave at once by automobile for Salmon River, where they will inspect the re-forestation area of the Pelepeco Lumber Co. and return to the city about five o'clock in the evening.

At the dinner there will be some information about this port in its relation to lumber placed before the members of the association, and this is now being prepared by the secretary of the Board of Trade. It is hoped to have Hon. C. W. Robinson, Minister of Lands and Mines, and some of the prominent lumber men of the North Shore present at the dinner.

Monday, July 27.—Delegates to the British Empire Forestry Conference were in Montreal yesterday, where they visited the forests products laboratory at McGill University, afterwards going on to St. Anne's to MacDonald College. They go on today to the Maritime Provinces, visiting on the way the Laurentide Paper Company at Grand Mere.

They will arrive at Campbellton on July 30, Chatham July 31, St. John August 1, Fredericton August 2, and come back to Quebec and Montreal August 3 and 4.
