Re-elected at Annual Meeting of Navy League-Reports of a Successful Year.

A year of much success was reviewed, the annual meeting of the New Brunsrick branch of the Navy League held esterday afternoon. All the former of-cers were re-elected.

The secretary, C. B. Myles, also had received \$25. Vacancies in the naval service having been reported, J. E. Bingham, of St. John, was secured a place in the service. Four relief cases were aided. Announcement was made that, through the action of the dominion branch, instructions had been issued to all shipping masters to give the preference to British subjects when engaging seamen. Assistance had been given in providing certificates to seamen who had lost theirs.

The membership figures were given as follows:—Life, nineteen; annual, 246; associate, 322, and several juniors. It was amounced that there was a possibility of having the boys in the Boys' Naval Brigade listed in the navy list, and if this could be done it would greatly incourage the boys. The Ontario division had given notice that it would seek autonomy when the annual meeting of the dominion branch was held.

The treasurer, H. C. Schofield, reported tal receipts, \$12,981.82, including mem-riship fees, \$784.50; interest, \$240.80; minion council, \$1,200; balance cared forward, \$10,757.02. The balance maining was \$8,317.25, and the larger expenditures included relief, \$731.50; grant for the Davidson building, \$5,042; and Nelson day campaign expenses in 1920, of \$2,440.

Correspondence read included a letter
