### CANADIAN WOUNDS BATHED IN TEARS OF GRATEFUL PEASANTS

Battles Fought and Lives Given For More Than an Abstraction

A Visit to French Villages Where the Huns Had Wrought Their Cruel, Beastly Work—What Village of Leuwarders Disclosed

With the Canadian Forces, Nov. 5—A curious example of German sympathy exists in the village of Leuwarders on the walls of a barn converted by the Boche into a concert hall. The artist, of no mean talent, has used these flat spaces to exhibit a series of three pictures that might well bear the motto "As Ye Sow So Shall We Reap."

In the first of these, a long horizontal panel, a finely drawn and colored bull is seen drawing a heavy wooden plow. In the furrow guiding its strains a young Frenchwoman, flat-breasted and dulled by field labor, but with still a measure of beauty. The next depicts an old Frenchman, knotted and bowed, sowing the field. A little boy toddles beside him. Behind him a village church and a windmill. With a savage fidelity the artist makes mute despair the keynote of both these groups—the woman straining at the plow and the old man wearily casting seed; for here cannot be that joy of labor that even as it plants seed in the long months to follow first the tender sprouting grain, then the wind on the corn, the harvest field, and safe-garnered fruits of the earth in neatly ordered stacks awaiting the threshing. Despair drags at their feet, they toil to make fat the destroyer.

Relentlessly the third picture drives home this horrid truth. Springing a scythe in the yellowing cornfield is the great central figure of a Prussian soldier, terrible, with the same unerring fidelity a ferocious crouching figure of long arms, knotted hands and wide-spread legs, repulsive as the gorilla. Power it has and strength and cunning; the wheat sheaves bow before it. With a fine compelling touch of irony the artist fills in the background with marching German soldiers—force directing the harvest.

He has taken away with him everything. Not a horse nor a cow, a pig nor a hen is left in the country. In one village he took even the fat, yellowed milk was keeping alive a sick child. He burned the straw he threshed. Where he could not remove grain he scattered it over the barnyard. After the peasants' houses, they are stripped. Nothing is left. The sack has been systematic. We captured at Leuwarders a trainload of furniture taken from the village, all neatly packed and labelled, by order of the army command.

### THE QUESTION OF THE GERMAN COLONIES

#### British White Paper Shows Nations Averse to German Rule

London, Dec. 19—Correspondence relating to the wishes of the natives of the German colonies as to their future government has been issued as a White Paper and furnishes unquestionable evidence that the one thing that the natives dread is being handed back to the Germans, and the one thing most of them desire is that they should continue under the Union Jack.

In Southwest Africa, the Germans have shown themselves totally unfit to govern the natives, and the return of the country to them would be regarded by every native tribe as the greatest disaster in their tribal history. In 1904, the Hereros numbered, according to the lowest German estimates, 80,000; Hottentots, 20,000; Berg Damarsas, 30,000; while in 1911 the official German census showed they only numbered 15,000, 9,800 and 12,500 respectively. The leader of the Whitebuck Hereros, in written testimony, says: "If this country is to become German again, I and my people ask to be allowed to leave and trek to another country, where we may live in peace under the British flag. If the German soldiers come back, a great revenge will be taken. The British courts give us justice; we have good treatment, and when the Germans ill-use us, they are punished. They are forbidden to thrash us, and ill-use us at their pleasure, as was their custom under German rule."

"We all wish to heaven we may never see the German flag here again."

In the case of German East Africa it was an error to assume from the outbreak of the war that the natives of this country as a whole, looked forward eagerly to deliverance from the tyrannical German rule. It would have been a matter of small difficulty to establish the popularity of the British rule at the outset had the exigencies of the war permitted, but this was not the case. The conditions of the campaign required heavy and increasing demands on the natives for assistance, both in personnel and material. Yet on the whole, the tribes have borne the strain surprisingly well. The native has suffered from heavy exactions, first of the Germans, and then of ourselves, but as a rule he is inclined to comfort himself with philosophic reflection of the native proverb, "When elephants fight, it is the grass that suffers."
