Clever Cast Present "The Girl of the Mountains" in York Theatre at Two Performances

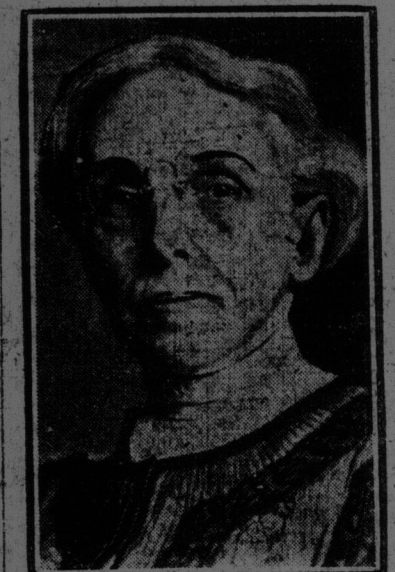

No notice of the exclusion has yet been received by the custom house authorities here. The price of potatoes ranges from \$1.25 to \$1.35 a barrel here at present (Dec. 29). The hauling on the country roads is rather heavy, and, for that reason, not a great many Aroostook tubers are being brought into the local market just at present.
