CANADIANS DOING WELL AT BISLEY

Bisley Rifle Camp, July 9.—Corporal Mortimer scoring 72 at 1,100 yards, a total of 170 in fifteen rounds has won the first prize in the Edge competition, which is of the value of \$50. His score included four centrais at 1,000 yards and five at 1,100. He was four points ahead of Col. Fremantle of Buckinghamshire.

Canada, whose successes were the principal feature of last year's competition at Bisley, made a promising start today at the opening of this year's meeting. Corporal Mortimer, of Quebec, secured the first notable victory by winning the Bass competition with a score of 95, making 46 at 1,000 yards, and 49 at 1,100 yards.

The Bass is a match rifle competition in the Hopton aggregate, open to all comers, for prizes of the aggregate value of fifty pounds, distances 1,000 and 1,100 yards, ten shots at each. The first prize, which has been won by Corporal Mortimer, is ten pounds. Corporal Mortimer scored an aggregate of 97 yesterday in the Waldegrave competition, which is also a squadded competition in the Hopton aggregate series for prizes of £50, the first being £10.

Major Piley of England, was first with 89, and Whitehead and Gibbs, of England, were second and third, with 88. The weather is much improved and the prospects for the Canadians are generally favorable.
