THE LATEST HARBOR PIRACY. A Captain and his crew found, captured, and shot in their Bertha. For some weeks past the brig Matilda, Capt. Thomas Cannington, was receiving a cargo of kerosene oil at Humber's Point, consigned to a Liverpool house. On Saturday morning the Liverpool hand out from her moorings and she dropped anchor near Governor's Island, preparatory to her sailing for Liverpool. To-day a crew was to be shipped, and Peter Robinson, the first mate, was the man selected for the duty. About 3 o'clock yesterday morning, while Robinson was on the deck of the vessel, he was surprised by four masked men with revolvers. He was seized by the throat by one of the pirates, while the other three fell upon the deck with the intent to kill him. Robinson was the work of a few minutes, and he was so quietly done that none of the other articles of the brig were alarmed. Maudie, the third mate, was the only one who was not taken. He was bound and gagged, and having no other means of escape, he was taken to the cabin in which slept Captain Cannington, his wife, and their three children. The knocking on the door awakened the Captain, who sprang from his berth and called to who was outside. One of the pirates answered that the Harbor Police were aboard, and ordered the Captain to open the door. As he did not comply, they fired upon him, wounding him in the upper part of the right leg. The door was burst in, and five masked pirates with revolvers entered. They demanded the \$4,000 ransom money, and when it was not forthcoming, they ransacked all the drawers and boxes, and took all the money they could find. They also took a check for \$600 in gold and silver, a gift to Mrs. Robinson from a sister who was on board. One of the pirates struck Robinson on the head with a valuable ornament, and he was so badly injured that he was taken to the hospital. The pirates then departed in one boat, leaving Robinson in the darkness. Mrs. Robinson released her husband and bandaged his leg, and then returned the other evening. Robinson and Evans went day and told the story to Sergeant Gault, who sent Lieutenant Spence to investigate.
