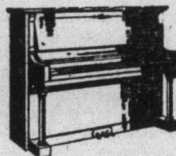

EUGENICS NOW AND FIFTY YEARS AGO

London, Nov. 15.—In the quiet of her retreat at Farnborough, the venerable and forlorn Eugenie, once empress of the French and "the most beautiful woman of Europe" will be able to recall within the next day or two the fiftieth anniversary of one of the greatest triumphs of her brilliant career.

This was the formal opening of the Suez Canal, on November 17, 1869. Emperors Kings and potentates of many kinds took part in the elaborate ceremonies that attended the inauguration of the canal, but the Empress Eugenie took precedence of them all. The ships that first passed through the long, still line of clear green water were led by L'Aigle, the French imperial yacht. In front of L'Aigle floated a golden bee. Behind Eugenie's yacht floated a fleet—a fleet which carried almost all the known flags of all the nations. From boat to boat from shore to shore, the cry rang out, "Vive l'impératrice." That was half a century ago.

Mohammed Said gave a grand ball in honor of the occasion. Probably so many nationalities of the earth never before been gathered together. The Empress Eugenie entered that packed assembly leaning upon the arm of the Emperor of Austria, followed by a representative of the Sultan of Turkey.

Never in imperial Paris had the Empress looked more lovely nor been more exceptionally well attired. Her women had robed her in one of the few rooms contained in the house. Up the broken steps the Emperor of Austria went to pay homage to the beautiful empress. M. de Lesseps followed him, no less proudly, no less welcomed. Imperial soldiers mounted guard. The Arab sang "Vive le petit caporal." And Eugenie, coming forth into the moonlight, shamed the beauty of the eastern night, as was described by one of the famous correspondents present.

Now—how changed. The Emperor of Austria—De Lesseps—Mohammed Said—Eugenie. All of the eminent participants of that grand ceremony have passed beyond, excepting the widowed little lady at Farnborough, who lives in the past.

Con. Mathies is thoroughly overhauling his property lately purchased from the late J. Klein survivors. He will have one of the nicest properties in town.

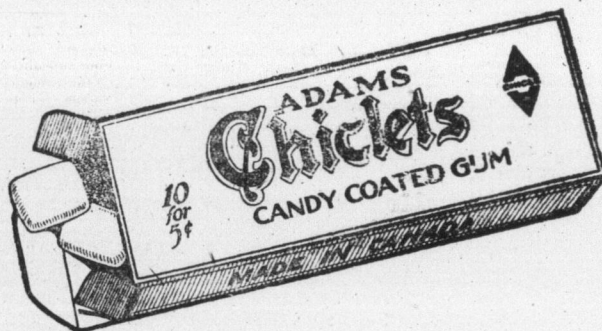
