

BRODEUR, LOUIS PHILIPPE (*Rouville*).

Ancestors emigrated from La Vendee, France, to Can. about 16th century. S. of Toussaint Brodeur, farmer, and of Justine Lambert his wife. B. at Beloeil, 21 Aug., 1862, and ed. at the Coll. of St. Hyacinthe. M., 27 June, 1887, Emma, dau. of J. R. Brillon, Esq., notary, Beloeil. Graduated LL.B. at Laval Univ., and was admitted to the Bar, P.Q., July, 1884. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1891, and re-elected at last g. e. Elected Deputy Speaker, and Chairman of the House of Commons, 20 Aug., 1896. A Liberal.—99 *St. James St., Montreal*.

BROWN, JAMES POLLOCK (*Chateauguay*).

S. of David Brown and Jean Pollock, from Renfrewshire, Scot. B. at Beau River, 4 April, 1841. Ed. at Elementary Schools and at United States Business Coll., New Haven, Conn. M., 19 Feb., 1869, Miss Margaret Stewart. Is a general store keeper, farmer and grist-miller. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1891, and re-elected at last g. e. A Liberal.—*St. Chrysostome, P.Q.*

BRUNEAU, ARTHUR AIMÉ (*Sorel*).

B. at St. Athanase, P.Q., 4 March, 1864. Ed. at the Coll. of the Sacred Heart, in Sorel, and at the Jesuit Coll. in Montreal. M., at Quebec, 11 Oct., 1887, Arzelie, dau. of J. B. Cloutier, professor at Laval Univ. Is an advocate of Province of Quebec. Was Secretary of "Le Club National," of Montreal, from 1885 to 1887; Vice-Presdt. of the "St. Jean Baptiste Soc." of Sorel, and Presdt. of "Le Club des Jeunes Liberaux de Richelieu" First returned to House of Commons at bye-election, held 11 January, 1892, and re-elected at last g. e. A Liberal.—*Sorel, P.Q.*

BURNETT, LEONARD (*South Ontario*).

Father of Scottish descent, was a Yorkshire farmer, and having married Hannah Dickinson, dau. of a Yorkshire farmer, immigrated to Can. in 1846, and settled in Tp. of Pickering, Ont., where he d. in 1847. B. in Yorkshire, Eng., April, 1845. Ed. at the Public School, Greenwood, and at the Whitley Grammar School. M., 5 Jan., 1870, Sarah Jane, dau.
