Edmonton, Alta.	21 Sept./44	Thursday	Notification received that F/L R.D. Henderson (C11673)(Admin.) is posted effective 8th October, 1944, which means the Unit will be without the services of an S. Ad. O. Present plans provide for the doubling up of the duties of Adjutant and S.Ad.O., to be carried out by F/L L.R. Poczok (CAN C10900) (Admin.). There were no failures in the final Meteorology examination for students of Course 110 held today. The graduation ceremony for Course 109 was held, the "props" being presented to the graduates by the Commanding Officer, S/L G. Milson (C1976)(Admin.)	
	22nd Sept./44	Friday	P/O A.E. Nightingale (C48101)(P.R.O.) reported on temporary duty from No. 4 T.C.H.Q., to gather material on the closing on No. 4 I.T.S., for publication in both "Wings" and local newspapers. Every co-operation was extended and numerous pictures were taken. The Commanding Officer held a meeting of Section Heads, one part of which was devoted to the outlining of a plan for sports during the week. The C.O. stressed the importance of personnel leaving the strain and worry of their jobs for as much as half a day a week in order to participate in sports. Agreement was expressed that this plan was practical inasmuch as personnel would work harder before and after the period of recreation. This afternoon the Station Band presented a concert in the Auditorium in aid of No. 4 I.T.S. Women's Auxiliary "Prisoner of War Fund". The Auditorium was filled to capacity necessitating extra folding chairs in the balcony; an indication of the high reputation enjoyed by the band. The concert of one and half hours duration was enjoyed greatly according to the applause received. Soloists were Miss Betty McCaskill, soprano, Edmonton girl, who sang beautifully, and R150890 LAC Lindskoog, G.T., Bandsman "B", violinist, who performed brilliantly as he has in the past. In all \$126.00 was raised for the fund.
