

As leader of the Official Opposition in this House of Commons, I deem it a privilege to join with the Right Honourable the Prime Minister in the sentiments which he has expressed on behalf of the Canadian people in appreciation of the truly great and noble life of the late King Albert I of Belgium; and of the loss which Belgium and the world has sustained in the late King's sudden and tragic death.

I join as well, on behalf of honourable members on this side of the House, in the sympathy which the Prime Minister has expressed with Her Majesty the Queen of Belgium, and the members of the Belgian Royal Family, in their personal bereavement, and with the people of Belgium in their national loss.
