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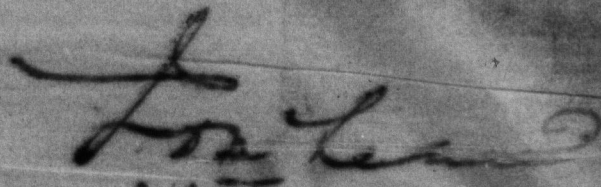
Ottawa, January 18, 1911.

Rev. Sir,-

In reply to part of your letter of the 6th instant, reporting that the Indians of Fort Alexander Reserve had applied for permits to cut 500 cords of green wood, presumably for sale, I beg to inform you that permits may be given to applicants being members of the Band, to cut and sell 500 cords of wood subject to payment of dues at tariff rates, and arrangements should be made in order to secure the best price obtainable and a purchaser who is thoroughly reliable.

It is assumed that there is abundance of wood on the Reserve to supply the future wants of the Band for all purposes.
