
Sir:

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 12th instant, enclosing the quarterly return of the Oka Country School for the quarter ended September 30th, 1912 and in reply beg to inform you that a cheque for \$11.25 being the amount of the salary due for the 15 days this school was open during that quarter is being sent to the Treasurer of the Methodist Missionary Society, Toronto.

The Department requires all day schools to be open 200 days in each school year and the salary due for Mr. Whitebeans services, he being a new teacher and therefore not entitled to be paid for summer holidays, is $\frac{15}{200}$ of the yearly grant of \$150 or \$11.25

As far as the Department is aware this school was not open from September 30th 1912, to January 27, 1913. For the March quarter 1913 a cheque for \$29.25 was sent to the Treasurer, being payment of the salary of Miss Lunan, the present teacher, for the 39 days she taught this school during that quarter.
