## 12. MEDICAL SERVICES

(Figures in brackets are those of previous report)

## (a) Medical Boards

For the week ending 16th August, 1941, a total of 718 (544) medical boards on members of the Canadian Army (Active) were reviewed and approved at N.D.H. 1. Of this number 358 (238) were Category "E" Boards.

Category "E" Boards represented .15% (.10%) of the total Canadian Army (Active) strength overseas and in Canada of 238,033 (227,999) as at 9th August, 1941.

# (b) Hospitalization

Weekly hospital returns to August 16th, 1941, show a total sick in hospital of 3,831 (3,826) distributed as follows:

Military Hospitals	2,682	(2,555)
D.P. & H.H. Hospitals	788	(2,555) (896)
Civilian Hospitals	361	( 375)

This represents a sick wastage of 2.80% (2.81%) based on the Active Army strength in Canada of 136,663 (136,070) as at 9th August, 1941.

## (c) Medical Supplies and Equipment

- (ii) Instructional films relating to the medical examination of recruits have been forwarded to all Military Districts.
