Technical Personnel

Interpretation

300. In this part unless the context otherwise requires

- (a) "employer" includes His Majesty in right of Canada and in right of any province;
- (b) "essential work" means work which is, in the opinion of the Director, essential to the efficient presecution of the war; and
- (c) "technical person" means a person described in Schedule "A".

Supply and Demand

- sol.(1) When a person ascertains that he requires or will require to engage a technical person or that he will be laying off or discharging a technical person, and when a person discharges or lays off a technical person, he shall forthwith supply the Director at Ottawa with such information as to his requirements or the technical person discharged or laid off or to be discharged or laid off as may be prescribed.
- (2) When a technical person desires to obtain new employment or is, or knows that he is going to be, unemployed or not employed full time on remunerative work of a kind for which he is especially qualified, he shall forthwith supply the Director at Ottawa with such information as may be prescribed.

Control of Employment

- 302.(1) No person shall enter into a contract or arrangement for the services of a technical person without the approval of the Director.
- person during any day and no person shall pay any remuneration or salary to a technical person in respect of any day if the employment or arrangement under which he is employed came into operation without the approval required by these regulations or any other regulations.
