

ACCUSED (cont'd)

Q. Do you still feel pain as a result of that accident in the leg and thigh?

A. Yes

Q. Have you ever been excused duty due to that stiff or painful leg?

A. Yes

Q. How many examinations by Medical Officers have you had in England? A. 5 times.

Q. You are still feeling that pain?

A. Yes.

PROSECUTOR The prosecution is going to demand to see that famous scar.

Q. Will you show us the scar?

(the accused shows the scar on right leg)

Show the other leg to the Court - both legs.

Prosecutor. I will ask the Court to look at both legs for comparison.

Q. When you had that terrible misfortune and had your leg crushed, why didn't you see a Doctor?

A. I was too poor to pay for a Doctor.

Q. For whom and where were you working when the accident happened?

A. I was working for myself.

Q. Tell the Court where the accident happened.

A. Abitibi, P.Q. Canada.

Q. Tell the Court under what circumstances it happened.

A. I was working for myself cutting timbre.

EXAMINATION BY THE COURT

Q. Were you ever examined by an Army Doctor in Canada?

A. Yes.

Q. How many times by Army Medical Officers?

A. Three times in all. Twice besides the time when I was enlisted.

Q. Were you suffering from pain at that time in Canada?

A. Yes.

Q. Did you tell the Medical Officers in Canada about your pain ~~xxxx~~ ?

A. Yes.

Q. Were you ever treated in Canada for these pains?

A. No. I always treated myself for all my pains.

Q. Did you ever parade sick in Canada on account of the pains?

A. Yes.

Q. What treatment did you receive when you paraded sick in Canada?

A. They only put some tincture of Iodine on my leg and gave me remedies to move my bowels.

Q. When you enlisted did you disclose your disability to the Examining Doctors?

A. I told them sometimes my legs were aching but on others they were better.

Q. Were you limping the day you enlisted?

A. No Sir.

Q. When did you first start to limp after you enlisted?

A. It started the 15th. Dec 41 and since then it has always kept on.

Q. When did you set sail from Canada to come to England?

A. The 13 June of this year.

Q. When you were warned you were going Overseas did you tell any one of your complaint?

A. I did not complain. I felt they knew of my complaint. I often brought it to their attention and I thought they knew.
