

- A. We send them down to the Mission, at Mission City. There are about two there. The Indians here are poor, they cannot afford to send their children far away.
- Q. Would they like to have a day school on the reserve here?
- A. We would like to have a school here if we could get it.
- Q. If a school were established here would you undertake to see that the children attended regularly every day?
- A. It would be better if we had a boarding school here.
- Q. Are there any children going to the Mission school now?
- A. One or two from this village go there now. Lots of more children belonging to this band would go to a school if we had a school here.
- Q. Is there a church here?
- A. Yes.
- Q. And does the missionary come to see you?
- A. He comes once in a while.
- Q. What religion do the Indians belong to?
- A. All the Indians belong to the Catholic church. On No. 2 there is a church which belongs to the English church, and on No. 1 it belongs to the Catholics.
- Q. How often does the priest come to see you?
- A. Three or four times a year.
- Q. Where from?
- A. Mission City.
- Q. Is there a missionary for the church on No. 2 - the English church?
- A. Sometimes he comes once a year and sometimes twice.
- Q. Have you any doctor that comes to see you here?
- A. (BY Agent Graham): No there is no regularly appointed doctor, although they have the privilege of going to the railway doctor, who charges it up to the Dominion.
- Q. Is there a doctor at Lillooet?
- A. Yes, we used to get the doctor from the Government, and I guess he got paid from the Dominion, but he charged us every time we went to see him.
