THIS VALUABLE COLLECTION contains among the American portion an account of a most dangerous voyage performed by CAPTAIN JOHN MONK to HUDSON STRAITS in order to discover a passage that way to the West Indies, with a description of Old and New Greenland, maps and plates, 1619-20. VOYAGE to the COAST of CHILE, 1642-43, under the command of HENRY BREWER, curious old maps. NIEUHOFF'S (John) remarkable voyages and travels in BRAZIL 1592-1629, large maps and copperplates, altogether this old traveller occupies 326 pages and has numerous full page plates and maps.
