Continental advices by mail state that in France home supplies, although still moderate, were on a rather more liberal scale at the departmental markets than of late. At the commencement of the week a rather firmer tone was noticeable in the trade for fogeign wheat but prices afterwards drouped, owing to the dull reports from foreign markets. Bed winter at Answerp stood at 55s per qr. Belgian imports of American wheat during September reached 400,000 qrs, of which a good deal was re-exported to Germany. German markets seem to have been in active. At Hamburg the weather was fiane, and the wheat trade quiet but firm. Stocks were still small, but supplies had increased somewhat. 
