1.05 p.m.-War Veterans and Brigades reform and March Past, en route to Government House where his Excellency the Governor will present the King's Colours (Replacement) to the Royal Nfld. Regiment. An officer will receive the Colour on behalf of the Regiment and deposit same in the Government House.
