

MAN TO BEARD.—The contest over the admission of ladies to the regular study of medicine and graduation in Edinburgh University still continues. The *Senate* persists in its obstructive course, and, as is usual in such cases, strengthens the cause of the fair appellants. An extra academic lecturer asked for license to deliver lectures exclusively to ladies, on the understanding that attendance upon his classes should be recognized as part of the regular medical course. This the *Senate* refused, on the plea that there was no evidence that the gentleman was qualified, though he had a certificate under their own hands that he was. Then the decision given by the lord ordinary, in favor of the right of ladies to study, according to the university laws as they now stand, has been appealed to the Inner House, and every intimation given out to the latter end. In the meantime public opinion seems to side more and more with the ladies. Money to prosecute the matter to its legal issue comes in freely—one subscription being as high as \$1,000—so that one side is as resolute as the other to see "the matter through."

RATIONALISTIC UNIVERSITIES.—The *European Journals* mention that at this time Rationalistic Institutions of the continent are almost entirely abandoned by students, and Evangelical universities crowded by large numbers. The Rationalistic Prof. Loening, at Strasburg, has but two pupils; the famous Schenkel, at Heidelberg, has commenced his new term with four, and the Liberal University of Leisau, in Hesse Darmstadt, commences the year without a single new pupil, while the Evangelical professors at Erlangen and Leipzig have attracted more than four hundred students, who attend the lectures of the orthodox professors.

A few days since a lady, well-known in the literary annals of Germany, died at an advanced age at Weimar. Ottilie von Goethe, the widow of Goethe's only son, and herself a writer of uncommon ability, departed this life on the 26th ult. In the days of her father in law she used to do the honors of the house, and presided at many a social gathering marked by the presence of the most eminent authors and politicians of the age.—Goethe, it is well known, loved her as a daughter, and admired her as a poet and litterateur, and at the time she edited the *Mitternacht Zeitung* (*Midnight Gazette*) used to speak of her as one of the ablest critics of the age.

A man recently broke off a marriage because the lady did not possess good conversational powers. A friend told him he should have married her, and then refused her a new bonnet, to have developed her power of talk.
