RATIONALISTIC UNIVERSITIES.—The European Journals mention the fact that the Rationalistic Institutions of the continent for almost entirely abandoned by students, and Evangelical universities crowded by large numbers. The Rationalistic Prof. Leening, at Strasburg, has but two pupils; the famous Schenkel, at Heidelburg, has commenced his new term with four, and the Liberal University of Leeissen, in Hesse Darmstadt, commonoes the year without a single new pupil, while the Evangelical professors at Erlangen and Leipsic have attracted more than four hundred students, who attend the lectures of the orthodox professors.

Ottille von Goethe, the widow of Goethe's only son, and herself a writer of uncommon ability, departed this life on the 26th ult. In the days of her father in law she used to do the honors of the house, and presided at many a social gathering marked by the presence of the most sminent authors and politicians of the age.—
